### ADMINISTRATIVE HISTORY

This collection came in a box of 7 or 8 separate scrapbooks. The only context about this collection was an inventory list from the early 2000s. The collection only covers mainstream political parties. The archivist has a theory that there was more of these scrapbooks since they have a distinct naming system (State-Tax, Candidates C-D). She purports it was the secretary's job to save clippings as a reference archival initiative to document past legislators and preserve institutional knowledge.

### SCOPE AND CONTENT

The legislators' series comprised of four scrapbooks. The first scrapbook was simply labeled as Candidates. This scrapbook focuses on primaries, campaign events and debates including non-white male candidates. The rest of the scrapbooks mainly focus on white politicians. The second scrapbook focuses on conservative politicians. They are Rolf Nelson, Harmon Ogdahl, Pillsbury and Wolcotts' political career. The archivist would like to remind the researcher that politics was very different in the 1960s as compared to the time this finding aid was written in 2021. The DFL scrapbooks were the most enlightening. The most absurd politician was Edward Gearty. His political diatribes which were published were very of the time and quite backwards now. He is known for being the last gentleman of the senate and died in 2009. The final scrapbook contained clippings of articles of politicians who just had last names that were alphabetically between the letters H-W. Leo Mosier is particularly interesting if you want to know the history of taxation.

The general legislature folder was simply a scrapbook labeled as general legislature.

The Metropolitan series focuses on four issues: MAC, Park Board, Sewage and taxes. MAC is an acronym that stands for the Metropolitan Airport Council. The council decided that the Twin

Cities needed another airport. One was built in Saint Paul. The clippings tell an interesting story of communities that wanted the benefits of having an airport and objecting when the land near them is on the contender list because of noise complaints.
